TREASURER'S UPDATE from Jeff Weesies: The regular checking account has \$6,279.33 and our CD has \$7,086.89 for a total of \$13,366.19. The memorial fund has \$1,488.01 in it at the current time. Thus we are sitting in a good spot financially again to start the year with our 3 accounts totaling \$14,919.15 as of April 18, 2016. As per the Board's request we have transferred our accounts from Comerica bank to Shelby State Bank except for the CD which we will do when it matures July 2018.

National History Day students competing well again this year

We are uniquely fortunate to have a dynamic after-school academic program in our local schools (grades 4-12) in which students volunteer to do research, compile extensive bibliographies, and design a presentation of their work. This nationally-run program is called NATIONAL HISTORY DAY.

Students compete first in District (winter), then winners go statewide (end of April), and finalists can compete for national awards at the June finals near Washington, D.C. Here are recent 2017 winners at **State Level** on the 2017 theme of **TAKE A STAND**, as reported by one of their coaches, Jan Klco:

The National History Day State contest yesterday [April 29] at Bay City Central High School had 535 students with 320 entries, a 19% increase over last year's record. Our students did very well. The Youth entries are from Ealy Elementary, our Junior Division special award winner is from NBC Middle School in Montague, and in the Senior Division, Lauren and Morgan are from Whitehall High School, while Tiffanie and Jess are with the Whitehall Home School Group. We look forward to having them and their entries at the May meeting.

Michigan's Heritage Park

Two years ago, my husband and I took our two godchildren, ages 8 and 10, to Michigan's Heritage Park, newly opened just to the east of US31 in Whitehall. As they brushed off the sand-covered mastodon near the entrance, I wondered whether all this 10,000+ years of history would be too much for them. Not to worry! They delighted in the wigwam and touching the artifacts in the fur trader's cabin. An hour passed, and we were only part of the way through, so we went back for lunch at the convenient picnic tables where we had left our little cooler. Then on to the Civil War exhibit. Andy got dressed up as a civil war soldier, feeling the weight of wool clothing, canteen, and multiple other layered items. Hannah was fascinated by the enclosures and showed her brother how she could lock him out. They were both especially fascinated by the secret display out back (you'll have to visit the Civil War encampment yourself to find out). Many other delights followed, including the hoop throwing game at the farmhouse. Suddenly, it was four in the afternoon (we had started at 11:00)!
