#### **Letter from our WLAHS President: (April 2023)**

With the arrival of spring the WLAHS embarks on another season of historical presentations. As a board we try to schedule meetings that will be informative as well as those that encompass of variety of interests. Last year we learned from the youth of our community, toured some unique residences, and learned about the evolution of police work in the White Lake area.

Our membership and finances have remained stable, and we are looking to expand our visibility in the White Lake area. To this end we will be posting information in the Lakeshore Connection Community Showroom located in Montague Foods. This year I am especially happy to celebrate two events which pertain to our historical community:

1. Dr. Dan Yakes (one of our own) was the recipient of the El Award presented last October to "an individual influential in the community, and who has been affiliated with various organizations, involved in local efforts, and connected with the business community". The El Award is given in memory of Eleanor "El" Polley, former director of the White Lake Area Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Yakes is a local historian with many books to his name; he has also been a recipient of the Muskegon Community College Distinguished Faculty Award. Dr. Yakes was the recipient of the 2021 WHAHS Noted Historian Award. CONGRATULATIONS to him from all of us!

2. In June of 2022 15 Michigan National History Day (NHD) students received special honors for their research and presentations on the year's theme: "Debate and Diplomacy in History". Alison Chen placed 8th in the nation with her Senior Individual Performance; Laura Thielman placed 4th in the nation with her Senior Individual Documentary. Alison Chen also won the "Chronicling America Award" for Best Use of Historical Newspapers through Library of Congress database. CONGRATULATIONS!

More news for NHD students: Megan LeaTrea and her coach Jan Klco have been selected, along with 15 other teacher-student teams from across the United States, to travel, all-expenses-paid, to Hawaii in June of 2023 where they will participate in the National History Days Summer Institute. Their theme is "Sacrifice for Freedom: WWll in the Pacific". Jan and Megan, along with the 15 other teams, will be working together learning and researching about WWll history on Oahu, Hawaii.
